The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators, Kenya Branch has organised the above 1 ½ day assessment to be held online on **14th & 15th July, 2021**.

About the Course and Eligibility

The standard Route to Membership is by attending Tutorials and the passing of written examinations up to Module 1 level. It has been recognized that this standard Route to membership may not be appropriate for experienced Lawyers and Arbitrators who have been in active practice for three or more years. This special program is open to members and non-members of the Institute who are *experienced* Arbitrators with an approved legal qualification or civil litigation lawyers with at least three years experience *including appropriate exposure to arbitration law and practice*.

This Special Programme is complete if you:

1. Pass the Pre- Course Assignment
2. Pass the Oral Assessment Workshops
3. Pass the 3 1/2 Hour written Examination or Home based Online Examination.
*(The above examination mode will be determined and communicated to the candidates at least one (1) month in advance)

Course Assessment

The course is **not a teaching course but an assessment** of knowledge of relevant law including the law and practice of arbitration as well as self-presentation and judgment skills of the candidate.

To prepare for the course a pre-course reading workbook is issue and an extra reference reading list is attached to the application form. This should be read before attending the course.

An eligible candidate is deemed to be up to date with the law of contract, tort and evidence as well as the law and practice of arbitration, for purposes of qualifying.

The Assessment & Examination content

- Arbitration Agreement ; Jurisdiction & Powers; Arbitration Practice & Procedure
- Interlocutory applications; Costs & Interest; Procedural matters; The Award

Tutorial Fees

The Tutorial fee is **Kshs 45,500/- (Kenya Shillings Forty Five Thousand Five Hundred only)**. The fee includes the reading list, coffee/tea and lunch. The fee can also be paid by instalments provided the first installment of Kshs 25,500/- is received on or before the closing date of **Friday 4th June, 2021** and the balance paid in full all instalments are paid by Friday 9th July, 2021.

Examination Fees

The examination fee is GBP 174 for candidates applying directly to the UK and GBP 178 for those depositing in the Kenya Branch CBA Pounds Account. This being a membership program, participants will be required to have regularized their membership before registering the course. The Examination will be based on the 1996 English Act. The Examination fee can also be paid by installments provided all installments are paid before **Thursday 8th July, 2020**.

Kindly note that participants/ candidates opting for the installment option should contact the Branch accounts Officer.

Materials

Course materials will be available for collection or delivery at candidates cost or upon payment of the course fees. All participants will be expected to have the Arbitration Acts 1995 & 1996.

Day 1 - Wednesday 14th July, 2021 - Timings 08.00 to 17.30 hours. **(Oral Assessments)**

Day 2 - Thursday 15th July, 2021 - Timings 08.15 to 13.00 hours. **(Examination) or Released Online**

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What will happen at the assessment?

The assessment will take the form of a series of workshops where participants will be orally assessed on different aspects of the Arbitral process from a chosen scenario. The assessments will be based on knowledge of arbitration Law and Practice, Judgement and Self-presentation

What is expected of me at the examinations?

Candidates should note that this is a **three hour** open book examination; one is permitted to carry any text book to the examination room. Candidates must however note that all books including their workbooks that they intend to use at the examinations must not have written notes. (Highlighting and underlining is however permitted)
