About the Course

The Chartered Institute of Arbitrators Kenya Branch has organized the above Module span over three months with two, one-day tutorials to be held online:-

Tutorial 1 – 30th January, 2025

Tutorial 2 – 20th February, 2025

This course is designed to give you a detailed knowledge and understanding of the Law underpinning arbitration, procedural elements of domestic (ie. non-international) arbitration and general Practice of Arbitration to enable you understand and participate in such proceedings. The course focuses on legal principles, process, practice and procedure in domestic arbitration. The course will take the form of two (2) Tutorials (lectures & discussions). It is based on the content of a Workbook which will be collected after finalizing with the application process in advance. The application process will commence on **1st December, 2024**.

This Course is for you if:

- You are at the moment classified as an “Associate Member”.
- You are one wishing to understand this topic generally, for example as a party, party representative or witness.
- You wish to improve knowledge of Arbitration Law & Practice even if you will not participate at the exam.
- The course is a must for those who would like to progress to “Member” level MCI Arb and eventually attain qualification as a Fellow of CIArb having taken the subsequent Modules.

What are the learning outcomes?

On successful completion of this course candidates will be able to:

- ∞ Define what is meant by the term ‘domestic arbitration’.

- ∞ Identify, explain and apply the legal procedural principles, rules and agreements relevant to the conduct of a domestic arbitration:
- ∞ The legal framework, including limitations of matters that may be legally arbitrated;
- ∞ The contractual nature of the appointment of an arbitrator;
- ∞ The range and limitations of an arbitrator's powers and jurisdiction;

- ∞ The rights, duties and responsibilities of a party to an arbitration;
- ∞ The methods of initiating and processing an arbitration;
- ∞ The relevance of the court regarding all stages in an arbitration;
- ∞ The requirements of an enforceable award.
- ∞ Evaluate and apply the principles and legal requirements of a domestic arbitration.
- ∞ Evaluate issues and apply the law of domestic arbitration appropriately.
- ∞ Demonstrate practical skill in carrying out the tasks required in preparing for and progressing a domestic arbitration.
- ∞ Demonstrate skill in controlling a domestic arbitration, communicating effectively with the parties, applying the CI Arb Arbitration Rules and adopting appropriate procedures.

Course Assessment

Assessment of this module is by either one written coursework assignment taken online or a three (3) – hour written closed-book examination. In order to pass, you will be required to achieve 65% or 55% in the written Coursework or the written examination respectively. Candidates will be informed on the nature of the assessments which are determined on the basis of numbers due to the COVID-19 pandemic scenario.

Successful candidates :-

- will be awarded an Advanced Certificate
- Will be eligible to apply for Member grade of CI Arb, and take advantage of a range of educational and professional benefits
- May progress onto Module 2 and later 3 of the Domestic Arbitration pathway to Fellowship.

Tutorial Fees

The Tutorial fee is Kshs 47,000/= for members [Subscription Payments up-to date] and Kshs 51,000/= for non-members which includes a hard copy of the course materials. The fee can also be paid by installments provided the first installment of Kshs 25,000/- is received on or before the closing date of **Friday 24th January, 2025** and the balance paid in full before **Friday 14th February, 2025**. Extra cost for postage or delivery of the materials before course commencement will be borne by the participants.

Examination Date – 13th March, 2025

Examination Fee

The examination fee is **£178** (Great Britain Pounds One Hundred Seventy-Eight Only). This being a membership course, participants will be required to have regularized their membership before registering the course. The Examination will be based on the 1996 English Act. The Examination fee can also be paid by installments provided all installments are paid before **Friday 28th February, 2025**.

Materials

Course materials will be available for collection or delivery at candidates cost or upon payment of the course fees. All participants will be expected to have the Arbitration Acts 1995 & 1996.

Venue

The Tutorials will be held online unless otherwise communicated giving reasonable notice before any Tutorial.

MEMBERSHIP REQUIREMENT

Please note that under the pathways to fellowship, all subsequent assessments are membership examinations. Thus, **ALL** applicants are expected to have regularised their membership with the Chartered Institute of Arbitrators.
