FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What will happen at the course?

The course will take the form of a series of virtual lectures and discussions and includes the opportunity for you to take part in identifying issues from a set scenario.

After successful completion of the 2-day course, Assessment is completed through an online multiple-choice test accessed via Learn ADR, CIArb's online learning platform. Candidates will be given 28 days to complete and submit the assessment. Candidates are required to achieve a minimum overall mark of 55% to pass the course. Successful candidates will be informed immediately on completion and submission of the test.

There are two other Introduction courses, what is the difference and do I have to attend all three?

Because the use and flexibility of private dispute resolution is growing, the Institute recognises that some students may wish to learn more about Mediation or Construction Adjudication, so we also offer Introduction Courses specifically dealing with these topics.

You are more than welcome to attend more than one Introduction, but you only need to take one test from any one introductory program leading to Associate status.
